


Political Prisoners


News of the Day

Tehran, Iran – A spokesperson for Iran's Teachers' Organization reported that no official figures have been released on teachers and students arrested during recent protests. However, at least **200 student deaths** have been verified. A study indicates students were the second-most active group in demonstrations after the self-employed, with high casualties. Mohammad Davari said calls to protect teachers and students and release detainees were ignored, leaving schools' atmosphere "highly tense" with ongoing pressure on both teachers and students,

Soroush Sadeghi Zadeh,



Iltaf Akhundi, a 12-year-old Turkmen boy, was arrested on January 9 in Gonbad Kavus and is currently held at the Gorgan Juvenile Correction and Rehabilitation Center, where he is subjected to torture, psychological abuse, and forced confessions.



When the Law Falls Silent

Saleh Mohammadi Faces Execution

Saleh Mohammadi, a 19-year-old Iranian wrestler and bronze medalist at the 2024 SITAF International Cup in Russia, has been sentenced to death in Qom's Nabovat Square. He is on trial under charges of "intentional murder" and "enmity against God." His relatives say he was at his uncle's house during the incident, and the court refused to summon witnesses or review security camera footage.



The Story of a Loneliness

They kept him at home until morning, under the air conditioner and in his father's arms; this account is a story of profound loneliness.

Ali Asghar Mohammadi, 25, from Chamestan, Mazandaran, was killed by a direct gunshot on January 8 during the protests. His family stated that he was hit by three bullets in his legs and one in his heart, and security forces did not allow anyone to provide assistance. His death left a bitter memory for his family.
