


Political Prisoners

Jamal Pourmandfar, a resident of Dehdasht arrested during the nationwide protests in January 2026, has been charged with “moharebeh” and “propaganda against the state.” The charges were announced on February 4 by the Dehdasht Prosecutor’s Office. He was detained on January 10. The charge of moharebeh carries the risk of a possible death sentence.



News of the Day

During the 1404 protests, **eye injuries** became one of the most defining signs of repression. According to reports published by human rights organizations such as Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch, hundreds of serious eye injuries among protesters have been documented. Doctors and medical sources have reported dozens of cases involving complete loss of vision in one eye, and in a number of instances, due to irreversible destruction of the eyeball or risk of infection, full eye enucleation was performed.

When hundreds of eyes are damaged and dozens lose their sight forever, this is not merely an injury; it is a crime against humanity.

Iran’s Immortal Names

Kamyab Ahmadi, a 30 year old electrical engineering student at Islamic Azad University of Mamasani and a boxer, was shot and killed by live ammunition fired by Islamic Republic security forces on the evening of January 8, 1404, on Haft Tir Boulevard in his city.

Killing of Children by the Islamic Republic

Arvin Moradi Tavaqqo, a 15-year-old teenager from Shahriar, died on January 9, 2026, from severe injuries caused by a gunshot wound. According to reports, he had been shot two days earlier.



Empty Desks

The spokesperson for the Iran Teachers’ Organization stated that no official statistics have been released regarding the number of teachers and students arrested during the recent protests. According to him, the deaths of at least **200 students** have been verified. A study indicates that, after self-employed workers, students had the highest presence at demonstrations, and correspondingly, the number of student casualties and injuries has been high. He also reported a lack of cooperation from authorities in securing the release of detained teachers and described the atmosphere in schools as “**highly tense**.”

When the Law Falls Silent

Three brothers — **Arman, Rahman, and Saman Kianivafa** — are facing possible execution. On the evening of Sunday, January 25, 2026 plainclothes agents raided their family home in Shahin Shahr and arrested all three. According to reports, Arman, 24, a healthcare worker, has been sentenced to death twice.

Rahman, 22, a drywall worker, has also been sentenced to death twice, while Saman, 20, a barber, has been sentenced to death once.
