

Political Prisoners

At 8 a.m. on January 10, 2026, eight plainclothes agents raided the home of Yasin Fathi in Dehghan using two vehicles and arrested him after assaulting him. Thirty-six days later, despite repeated inquiries to security authorities, his family has received no information about his condition or whereabouts.



News of the Day

The first court session for three detainees from the 2025 nationwide protests Ehsan Hosseini-pour Hesarloo, Matin Ahmadi, and Erfan Amiri was held at Tehran's Revolutionary Court. They face serious charges including participation in murder, arson at Seyyed al-Shohada Mosque in Pakdasht, and acting against national security. Reports indicate the defendants were tried without chosen legal counsel, under torture, and forced confessions. Ehsan Hosseini-pour's lawyer stated that his initial confessions were made under coercion, and the most recent session footage shows even the court-appointed lawyer absent. Investigations suggest he was not near the mosque during the fire, with no witnesses or evidence placing him at the scene. The young age of the defendants and the rapid trial process raise concerns over the potential issuance and execution of death sentences before Nowruz


Iran's Immortal Names

Esra Tavousinia, 14, from Dasht Bolagh village in Sonqor and Kalai County, was critically injured by direct gunfire from Iranian forces during protests in Kermanshah on January 8, 2026. She died on February 3 after two weeks of severe injuries.



When the Law Falls Silent

Taha Alimirzaei, a 17-year-old teenager, was arrested following the 2025 protests and, according to reports, subjected to torture and forced confessions. He is at risk of execution, and human rights sources say the Islamic Republic is preparing to carry out his death sentence.

Killing of Children by the Islamic Republic

Masih Bigdeli, born in November 2011, was among those killed during the January 8 protests in Isfahan. He was present with his father on Khaghani Street when he was first struck in the leg by pellet gunfire and later shot in the face. He died from the severity of his injuries.
